CE1: English Revision for Exam 1

English Exam 1 will take place on the 26th and 27th of November 2020. The exam will be based on the units that we have studied in the *Family and Friends 1* books, the exercises in the **orange notebook** and the **homework assignments** that you've done. The page numbers below are from the *Family and Friends 1* student book. However, there are excellent exercises in the activity book as well. **All questions** will be similar to what we have done in class.



General

- Introductions (Hello. Goodbye. How are you? How old are you?): pages 4-5
- 1. **Grammar**: exercises in *Family and Friends 1* and the orange notebook
 - Sentence Punctuation: A sentence starts with a capital and ends with a full stop, a question mark or an exclamation mark. Names of people, days of the week and months start with a capital letter.
 - Introducing objects (What's this? It's a...): page 9
 - Possessive adjectives (my, your): page 15
 - Simple questions about objects and people (Is this...? Yes, it is. No, it isn't.): pages 15 and 31
 - Regular plural formation (adding an 's' at the end of a noun, e.g. book, books): page 21
 - This is and these are: page 21
 - Pronouns (he and she): page 21
 - Contractions (what is \rightarrow what's, she is \rightarrow she's): pages 9 and 31
 - Prepositions (in, on, under): page 37
- 2. **Vocabulary:** exercises in *Family and Friends 1*, the orange notebook and spelling homework You have already learnt all of these words for your spelling homework (except days of the week). I know that you know these!
 - Numbers 1-10: page 6
 - Days of the week: page 6.
 - Colours of the rainbow, black and white (page 7 and orange notebook)
 - School things: pages 8 and 10
 - Toys: pages 14 and 16
 - Parts of the body: pages 20 and 22
 - Jobs: pages 30 and 32
 - Park: pages 36 and 38

3. Reading and Listening Comprehension

- Reading comprehension: you will read a text and answer different questions. For example: pages 18 and 34 in *Family and Friends* 1.
- Listening comprehension: you will listen to a text and answer different questions.

4. Writing

Writing in full sentences, for example to describe pictures.

You have all been working hard in class. I know you will do well if you work carefully. If you have any questions, ask me! The more you revise the easier the exam will be. Try to study 10-15 minutes every day! I'm very proud of what we have learned together. Keep up the fantastic work.
