

## **English Revision for Exam 1**

Dear Students,

English Exam 1 will take place on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of November 2020. The exam will be based on the units that we have studied in the <u>Global English 2</u> books, the exercises in the orange notebook, plastic folder and the homework assignments that you've done. The page numbers below are from the <u>Global English 2</u> student book. However, there are excellent exercises in the activity book as well. . All questions will be similar to what we have done in class.

- 1. **Grammar**: exercises in *Global English 2* and the orange notebook
  - Plural: There is, There are example page 7 in <u>Global English + orange notebook</u>
    Regular Plural Formation: Adding an "s" at the end of a noun, example: book, books
  - Sentence Punctuation: A sentence starts with a capital and ends with a full-stop / period, a question mark or an exclamation mark. Names of people and places (cities, countries) start with a capital letter.
  - Possessive Pronouns: yours/mine example page 12 <u>Global English + orange notebook</u>
  - Questions words: who, what, where, why how many example page 21 <u>Global English + orange notebook</u>
  - Prepositions of place (Where is \_\_\_\_\_?): example page 26 and 27 in Global English
  - Prefix: un- page 30 <u>Global English + orange notebook</u>
  - Verbs in the present tense: be, go, like, eat, see, play, read, write, run etc
  - Articles: a, an *orange notebook*
  - Mage "e words; -ay and -ai words Global English and orange notebook
- 2. Vocabulary: exercises in Global English, the orange notebook and spelling homework
  - Days of the week.
  - The months of the year
  - Numbers in words: one to twenty; Numbers in numerals: 1-100
  - Colours: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple, pink, white, beige, brown, black, gold, silver
  - Family members: orange notebook
  - Phrases: phrases learned for our spelling tests
  - Compound Words: page 12 Global English and orange notebook

## 3. Reading and Listening Comprehension

- Reading comprehension: you will read a text and answer different questions.
  - For example: page 20/21/22/23 in Global English
- Listening comprehension: you will listen to a text and answer different questions.
  - For example: page 25 in Global English

## 4. Writing

- Answering questions in full sentences.
- Writing words in the correct order to make a sentence.
- Writing a letter page 22 Global English and orange notebook
