CM: English Revision for Exam 1

English Exam 1 will take place on the 26th and 27th of November 2020. The exam will be based on the units that we have studied in the **Oxford Discover 5** books, the exercises in the **orange notebook** and the **homework assignments** that you've done. The page numbers below are from the **Oxford Discover 5** student book. The **questions** will be similar to what we have done in class.



1. Grammar: exercises in Oxford Discover 5 and the orange notebook

- Future statements (predictions with *will*): page 13
- Future real conditional (also known as the first conditional, e.g. *If I revise hard, I will pass the test!*): page 21
- Asking quantity questions (*How much? How many?*): page 22
- Asking choice questions (*Is it ... or ...?*): page 23
- Verbs followed by infinitives (We hope to impress you with our exam results!): page 33

2. **Vocabulary:** exercises in *Oxford Discover 5*, the orange notebook and spelling homework You have already learnt all of these words for your spelling homework. I know that you know these!

- Space vocabulary: pages 8-9, pages 16-17
- Early civilisations: pages 28-29
- It is helpful to revise the words that are in your orange notebook and/or spelling homework but are <u>not</u> in your Oxford Discover 5. This could help to make your writing more exciting!

3. Reading and Listening Comprehension

- Reading comprehension: you will read a text and answer different questions. For example: pages 30-32 in *Oxford Discover 5*. Reading skills involve:
 - Identifying the author's purpose: page 29
 - Comparing and contrasting (finding similarities and differences): e.g. page 17
- Listening comprehension: you will listen to a text and answer different questions.

4. Writing

- Writing in full sentences with correct punctuation. See page 15 for more information on full (or 'complete') sentences.
- Author's purpose (be able to write for a purpose): page 29

You have all been working hard in class. I know you will do well if you work carefully. If you have any questions, ask me! The more you revise the easier the exam will be. Try to study 10-15 minutes every day!
